NATIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

Eid Milan Family Picnic 2015 - 9th August 2015

The Eid Milan family picnic is the main highlight of PAAMA national activities. It focuses on the educational, moral and physical training of members of the association as well as promoting social integration and strengthening the spirit of brotherhood and sisterhood of its members. The event takes place at the Jamia Ahmadiyya UK premises. Members listen to scholarly speeches, have a tour of the premises and engage in a number of sporting activities which the venue provides. Parents and children gain insight into the lives of the devotees of Ahmadiyyat Jama'at.

Pan-African Evening Event at Jalsa Salana 2015

PAAMA held its second Pan-African evening event at this year's Jalsa Salana UK to host delegates from Africa, Africans across Europe and African American delegates. The attendance this year far exceeded last year's attendance of 450. The theme for this year's event was "Celebrating the Centenary of Ahmadiyyat in Mauritius and Africa" as it coincided with the centenary celebration of Mauritius Jama'at.

Mungalsingh (Geriatrics Registrar, Kings College Hospital) with the theme, 'Aging Gracefully'. The session was very educative and exciting.

The morning session concluded with an address by the special guest, Mrs Amtul Wadood Cheema, Lajna National Secretary for Waqfe Jadid & Tahrike Jadid, UK, who represented the National Sadr, Lajna Imaillah.
