Writings of the Promised Messiah (peace be upon him)

“This is the Way of God. And since He created man on the earth He has always been demonstrating this Way by helping His Prophets and Messengers and granting them success and predominance... Rather, He causes them to die at such time as apparently forebodes a kind of failure and thereby He provides an opportunity for the opponents to laugh at, ridicule, taunt and reproach the Prophets. And when they have done all they could do in the way of ridicule and reproach, then He reveals a Second Hand of His Power and creates such means by which the objectives which had to some extent remained incomplete are fully realised... I came from God as Manifestation of His Power and I am a personification of His Power. And after I am gone there will be some other persons who will be the Manifestation of the Second Power [of God].”

SUMMARY OF FRIDAY SERMON



Hazrat Khalifatul Masih V^(aba) delivered a Friday Sermon on the 30th December 2016 in which he expounded upon the true Islamic way of celebrating a New Year. Huzur Aqdas admonished the members of the Jama'at to do self-introspection by asking ourselves the following pertinent questions:

- Have we fulfilled the pledge of not indulging in Shirk?
- Has the previous year been spent safeguarding against falsehood and treading on the path of truth?
- Have we kept ourselves away from such events that lead to ill thoughts?
- Have we protected ourselves from unchaste glances and are we still protecting ourselves?
- Have we tried to protect ourselves from civil strife and mischief?
- Have we safeguarded ourselves against all forms of maltreatment?
- Have we protected ourselves against treacherous acts?
- Have we protected ourselves from every kind of mischief?
- Have we safeguarded ourselves against all forms of disorder?
- Have we regularly offered Salah five times a day during the last year?
- Have we exerted ourselves to become regular in offering Tahajjud prayers?
- Have we been regularly invoking Durood on the Holy Prophet^(saw)?
- Have we sought forgiveness from Allah profusely?
- Have we been diligent in praising Allah?
- Have our hands and tongues refrained from harming others?
- Have we refrained from hurting others whether they were related to us or not?
- Have we pardoned and forgiven others during the past year?
- Has humbleness and modesty been a major part of our characteristics?
- Have we remained dedicated and loyal to Allah at all times of happiness, sadness, prosperity or poverty instead of being dismayed?
- Have we profoundly tried to follow the commandments of Holy Qur'an and the teachings of Holy Prophet^(saw)?
- Have we tried to achieve the high standards of good manners?

- Have we completely abandoned or even tried to restrict ourselves from arrogance and superciliousness?
- Has our daily conduct made us more religious and has it honoured and glorified our religion?
- Can each day testify that we gave precedence to our faith over the worldly affairs as we have pledged?
- Did we strive to progress in our love for Islam to such an extent that it was given priority over our wealth and over our honour and it was considered more beloved than our children?
- Have we progressed in compassion and kindness

towards the creatures of Allah?

- Have we reached our standard of obedience to the Promised Messiah^(as) to such an extent that all other relations become secondary?
- Did we pray to remain loyal and obedient to the institution of Khilafat?
- Did all the parents remind their children about the importance of Khilafat and guide them to remain loyal to it and did you pray that Allah may instil this in them?
- Did we pray regularly for the Khalifa of the time and the Jama'at?

"If the response to the above mentioned questions is in the affirmative then despite of some weaknesses, we would have gained a lot during this past year. But if most of the questions are answered in the negative, then it is a worrisome situation and we need to do some self-evaluation. And then pray during these last nights, make a pledge to ourselves and also pray at the start of the New Year that Allah may forgive any previous shortcomings, help eradicate our weaknesses and help us achieve the maximum (spiritually) in the coming year and be included among those believers who are forever ready to sacrifice everything for Allah, the Almighty."

On Saturday the 28th of January 2017 the Pan-African Ahmadiyya Muslim Association UK held a function to celebrate the life and character of the Holy Prophet Muhammad^(saw). This was PAAMA's first ever Jalsa Seeratun Nabi event held to highlight and celebrate the remarkable personality and excellent virtues of the Holy Founder of Islam^(saw).

The function took place in the Tahir Hall at Baitul Futuh and was chaired by PAAMA President, Tommy Kallon Sahib. After guests were seated the programme officially commenced with a recitation from the Holy Qur'an by Ali Mwanda, followed by its English translation by Abdul Quddous Witol. A Qaseedah (poem in praise of the Holy Prophet^(saw)) was recited by Ishmael Baffour, with English translation by Ali Muhammad.

Humayon Jahangeer Khan Sahib next addressed the gathering on the topic of 'The Holy Prophet^(saw): The Liberator of Women'. After the break for Asr Prayers, the meeting resumed with a recitation from the Holy Qur'an by Abiola Osota Sahib and its translation by Ahad Bhunnoo Sahib. Hamza Ilyas Sahib then read out his own English poem 'Je Suis Muhammad' (I am Muhammad).



The concluding address was given by PAAMA President Tommy Kallon on "The Life and Character of the Holy Prophet Muhammad^(saw)".

First PAAMA National Ijtema

On Saturday 15th April 2017, PAAMA UK held its first ever National Ijtema at Baitul Futuh. The event which was well attended by nearly 400 PAAMA men, women, boys and girls from across the UK started with Tahajjud and Fajr prayers, followed by breakfast and registration. The formal proceedings then started by way of a joint Opening Session.

As is customary, the programme commenced with registration of attendees and an exhibition showcasing PAAMA activities and a display of various Jama'at literature.

After members and guests were seated the programme officially commenced with the recitation of the Holy Qur'an by Lamin Jawo

After this the academic competitions commenced across all Tanzeems and ages groups: Lajna in the marquee, Nasirat in the mosque, with Ansar, Khuddam and Atfal remaining in Tahir Hall. sporting activities on the sporting grounds including football, Tug of war, 100 metres sprint, relay races, three-legged race and various other activities.

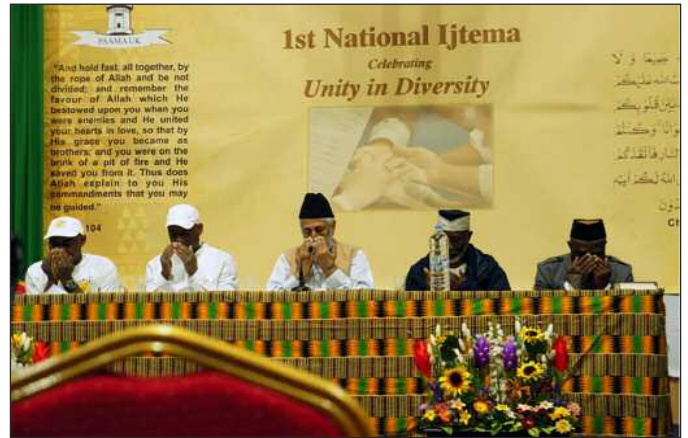

The Second and Third Prize distribution was done by Issah Wemah Sahib, former Chairman PAAMA UK, following which the Ijtema Report was presented by PAAMA President Tommy Kallon Sahib. In his report, he thanked Allah through Whose grace the Ijtema was being held and expressed gratitude to Hazrat Khalifatul Masih for his gracious permission to hold the Ijtema. He reiterated the theme of the Ijtema, Unity in Diversity, and expressed the importance of this theme as exemplified in PAAMA's various diverse backgrounds.

The reported attendance was 193 boys and men, and 160 ladies and girls, with 30 guests recorded making the total attendance as 383.

Next was the First Prize Distribution for academic and sporting events first on the ladies side followed by the gents with prizes given out by Mansoor Shah Sahib.

During his Closing Address Mansoor Shah Sahib, quoted the famed verse of the Holy Qur'an:

"O mankind, We have created you from a male and a female and made you into tribes and sub-tribes that you may recognise one another. Verily, the most

honourable among you in the sight of Allah is he who is the most righteous among you."
(Al-Hujurat, 49:14).

Acting Amir Sahib reminded all that all humans come from the same origin and that the only reason Allah created differences in humans is to enable us to identify one another and nothing else. He reiterated that Khilafat is the unifying force that binds us together and ensures we have unity notwithstanding our diverse backgrounds.

At the end, President Tommy Kallon read out a Special Message from Hazrat Khalifatul Masih for the attendees of the first PAAMA Ijtema. In his message, Huzur Aqdas admonished all *"to remain connected to the Jama'at and Khilafat..."* to *"consider Khilafat a great divine bounty and hold fast by the rope of Allah..."* to *"be thankful to Allah the Almighty for this gift"* and to *"pray for the Khalifa of the time and for the continuation of this blessing."*

The event concluded with silent prayers led by Acting Amir, Mansoor Shah Sahib.

Pan-African Jalsa Salana Event 2017

Under the directives of Hazrat Ameerul Mumineen, Khalifatul Masih V^(aba), PAAMA UK held a Pan-African Evening event at this year's Jalsa Salana UK on Friday 28th July 2017. The event took place immediately after Huzur Aqdas' Inaugural Address in the main Jalsa Gah at Hadeeqatul Mahdi.

The function was attended by over 600 African Americans, Africans from Europe, delegates from Africa and the Caribbean, African delegates from Europe and Africans in the UK. In attendance were the Amirs of Ghana, Nigeria, Tanzania, The Gambia, Mauritius, Uganda, Benin, Missionary In-charge USA, Missionary In-charge Belgium and In-charge Central French Desk. Also in attendance were distinguished Tabshir delegates from Africa and the Caribbean.

In his Welcome Address, Tommy Kallon Sahib, PAAMA UK, gave a brief background and overview of PAAMA and what it stands for: *"to unite, empower and inspire the African Ahmadiyya Muslim diaspora to serve Islam, society and Africa."* He enumerated some of the achievements of PAAMA over the last 30 years, highlighting the expansion of the Association to the USA and Italy as the latest advancement of PAAMA and acknowledged the presence of Maulana Abdullah Dibba Sahib who is now President of PAAMA USA.

Maulana Abdullah Dibba Sahib then gave a stirring account of *The Establishment of PAAMA USA*. He paid special tribute to PAAMA UK President Tommy Kallon for nurturing him by giving him the opportunity to serve PAAMA UK as Vice President

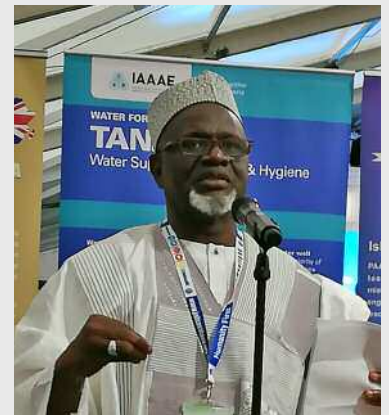
even though he was a Jamia Student at the time. He then recounted the story of the establishment of PAAMA USA and the emphasis Huzur Aqdas placed on PAAMA, including sending Tommy Kallon as Special Guest for the launch of PAAMA USA.

Maulana Muhammad Bin Saleh, Amir & Missionary In-charge Ghana, then spoke on *The Role and Vision of PAAMA*. He expounded on the objectives of PAAMA and the concept of Pan-Africanism, explaining that unity is vital to social and economic progress. Maulana Sahib also explained that unlike secular Pan-Africanist movements which tend to end in failure because they divorced God from their plans, PAAMA, under the guidance of the Divinely-guided Khalifa, was destined to succeed where secular movements failed.

This was followed by a Question & Answer Session. Among some of the questions asked were: "What role can PAAMA play in eradicating corruption in Africa" and "Can PAAMA participate in activism such as Black Lives Matter?" Amir and Missionary In-charge Uganda then led the gathering in Silent Prayers to conclude the official segment of the event.

Guests were then ushered to the European marquee for a sumptuous dinner.

Post Jalsa Salana Reception

The traditional PAAMA UK Post-Jalsa Salana Reception, hosted in honour of Jalsa Salana delegates from Africa and other senior members of the Jama'at, was held on Sunday 6th August 2017. The event included a Merit Award Ceremony in recognition of the distinguished Missionaries and Waqfeen both of African and non-African origin who had served the cause of Africa and Africans. The event was blessed with the presence of the Beloved Khalifa of the worldwide Ahmadiyya Muslim community, Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad, who presented the awards and had lunch with the attendees.

The first session of the event which was chaired by the Respected National President of the UK Jama'at, Mr Rafiq Ahmed Hayat, started with recitation of verses from the Holy Qur'an by Mr Toban Ephram and English translation by Mr Hassan Wahab. In his Welcome Address, the President of PAAMA UK, Tommy Kallon Sahib, apprised the attendees of recent achievements of PAAMA over the year, notably the launching of PAAMA Italy and PAAMA USA.

Amirs and National Presidents from Africa then presented brief updates on the progress of the Jama'at in their respective countries. The President of PAAMA USA, Respected Imam Abdullah Dibba, also gave a brief discourse on the launching of PAAMA USA.

In closing this session, Rafiq Hayat Sahib, remarked that from Ahmadiyyat's point of view, Africa must lead the way. Of the 600,000 Bai'ats gained by Jama'at

Ahmadiyya this year worldwide, a huge majority came from Africa. The first session of the event concluded with silent prayers after which attendees proceeded to the Fazl mosque to observe Zuhr and Asr prayers led by Huzur Aqdas.

The Second Session commenced after Zuhr and Asr prayers when the event was graced with the presence of Huzur Aqdas (aba), who presented the PAAMA Merit Awards for 2017 (see next page).

Following the Award Ceremony Huzur Aqdas (aba) led the traditional Silent Prayer after which lunch was enjoyed by all attendees. Songs of praises were presented at the end by the PAAMA Tirana team. The event was attended by over 500 people.

Maulana Hafiz Essan Secundar Sahib of Mauritius who has been a missionary for 30 years serving in Zaire, Rodrigues Island, and France; and as Amir and Missionary In-charge Benin for 7 years. He is currently serving as Missionary In-charge Belgium.



Maulana Muhammad Ali Kaire Sahib of Uganda who trained as a missionary at Jamia Ahmadiyya Pakistan and has since served the Jama'at in Uganda for 40 years as Regional Missionary, Naib Amir and presently as Amir and Missionary In-charge.

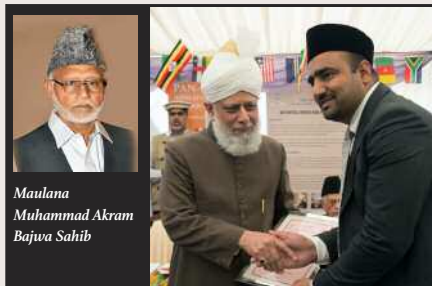


THE ABDUL RAHEEM NAYYAR AWARD

Bashir Ahmad Akhtar Sahib who served as an educationist in Sierra Leone for 21 years as a teacher and prominently as Principal Ahmadiyya Secondary School Bo for 11 years. Bashir Akhtar Sahib has also served as General Secretary UK for 12 years and is currently serving in the UK Jama'at History Dept.

AFRICA PEACE SYMPOSIUM

Unity in DIVERSITY



On Saturday 21st October 2017, PAAMA UK held its first ever National Africa Peace Symposium at the Baitul Futuh complex. The landmark event had as its theme “Unity in Diversity”. The Symposium sought to explore the unity that religion brings to our complex differences in all spheres of life, be they social, political or indeed religious. It also aimed to promote a deeper understanding of Islam and other faiths with a view to inspiring a concerted effort for lasting peace among the peoples of Africa. The event was attended by distinguished personalities from various walks of life including parliamentarians, diplomats, community and civic leaders, a 14-man delegation from Belgium and eminent members from the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community in the UK.

The Symposium opened with a recitation of the Holy Qur’an by Brother Toban Ephram and an English rendition given by Brother Misbahudeen Adewale.

In his welcome address, the President of PAAMA UK, Mr Tommy Kallon, expressed his pleasure and delight in welcoming all distinguished guests. He further reiterated the mission statement of PAAMA as being to unify, empower and inspire its membership to serve the religion of Islam, the interest of society and the welfare of Africa. He restated the theme of the Peace Symposium as “Unity in Diversity” explaining that this theme truly underpins the objectives and essence of PAAMA. “We should celebrate our differences but not be defined by them”, he furthered. Mr Kallon seized the opportunity to record his gratitude to all guests who had travelled from far and wide around the UK, and from across Europe and other parts in Africa. In concluding President Kallon alluded to a quote by His Holiness, Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad (aba) that “I firmly believe that if African countries and people unite together and fulfil the requirements of justice, then one day Africa will emerge as a true global power.”

This was followed by a video presentation encapsulating the services of various activities the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community undertakes in Africa through the International Association of Ahmadiyya Architects and Engineers (IAAAE) and Humanity First. These include the Water for Life

programme, building schools, libraries, science laboratories, hospitals, clinics and model villages; in this way, the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community helps to improve the lives of ordinary people across the continent of Africa.

The first guest speaker for the occasion was the first black female Mayor of Merton, Cllr Marsie Skeete, originally from Guyana. She drew a direct correlation between the advancement of a nation and the peace in that nation. “In these modern times with all the trappings of modern technological advancement we do not seem to have time for acceptance, compassion and tolerance, which are the foundation of peace”, the Mayor further elaborated. She alluded to peaceful practices adopted by Mahatma Ghandi, Mother Theresa, and Nelson Mandela to further buttress her stand on the subject. She concluded with a quote by Martin Luther King Jnr: “Violence as a way of achieving radical justice is both impractical and immoral.”

The next distinguished speaker was H.E Julius Peter Moto, the High Commissioner for Uganda. He stated that peace is something we cannot talk about without planting good seeds politically and the African continent is overwhelmed with political refugees all over as a direct result of lack of good governance. He cited examples of countries in Africa whose populations have been displaced because of political unrest and that Uganda, which has enjoyed relative



peace, has been host to over 1.2 million refugees from South Sudan. In concluding he praised the great efforts made by the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community in Uganda in building schools, hospitals, radio stations and erecting solar panels in various communities in the country.

The keynote address was given by the distinguished Lord Tariq Ahmad of Wimbledon, Minister of State at the Foreign and Commonwealth office. In his speech he expressed the significance and relevance of the Commonwealth in modern times. To see communities celebrating their diversity but recognising their strength in unity is a laudable feat. Lord Ahmad went further to elaborate how the theme of the Symposium “Unity in Diversity” loudly resonates with his roles in the Foreign and Commonwealth Office. He appealed to the diverse gathering to work with him and the Commonwealth to see how we can mitigate the effects of climate change, how we can keep people safe from violent extremism, cyber- attacks, human-trafficking and modern slavery and how we can protect our shared values. He highlighted the important role that faith groups can play as important peace brokers, for example, the role the Catholic Church played in negotiating peace between the FARC guerrillas and the Colombian government and the role that faith groups play in Ghana to broker peace and maintain a peaceful co-existence between diverse communities.

The next speaker was the Deputy High Commissioner of Ghana, Mrs Rita Tani Iddi. She expressed her joy in attending the event and also relayed apologies sent by His Excellency, the Ghana High Commissioner to the UK in whose capacity she attended. Mrs Iddi also tendered greetings to PAAMA on behalf of the government and people of Ghana. She acknowledged the good work that the Ahmadiyya Mission is doing in her country in the areas of education, health, education, provision of social amenities as well as moral and spiritual guidance in the country. She noted that most of the mission’s projects were accomplished under the leadership and guidance of His Holiness Khalifatul Masih V. She recalled and acknowledged the various roles His Holiness played in various capacities in the development of Ghana. She related to the symposium’s theme “Unity in Diversity” in relation to life in Ghana where though the population is very diverse but they always try to get together to have dialogue and a common understanding. She concluded with a promise ensuring that the essence of the symposium’s teachings is passed on to the Ahmadiyya Muslim community in Ghana.

The next guest speaker was H.E Dr Justina Mutale, Founder and President of the Justina Mutale Foundation (a scholarship program for under-privileged young women) and African Woman of the Year 2012.



Coming from a predominantly Christian community in Zambia that is relatively peaceful, Dr Mutale expressed her surprise at discovering the religious intolerance she is experiencing here in the West. She expressed alarm at the possibility of the human race (supposedly the most intelligent of God’s creation) on the verge of destroying itself at the push of a button. Dr Mutale referred to her traditional belief in the philosophy of “Ubuntu”; a traditional belief in Southern Africa that we are humans because of other humans. She also highlighted the worrying prospect of the US threat to exit the United Nations

and the UK exiting the European Union, and yet these are institutions formed on the background of preventing world conflicts and crises. She appealed that as humans we need to go back to the golden principles of doing unto others as you want others do unto you, and seeing that no one wins in wars. She echoed that the only hope for humanity’s survival is for peace to reign and concluded that we should go back to the principle of “Ubuntu”.

A short video presentation followed chronicling the numerous trips and visits made by Huzur to various world legislative bodies including the European



Parliament, the UK House of Parliament, Canadian Legislative House and the United States Congress where he took the message of peace and Love for All Hared for None and to world leaders from the Far East to Europe, from North America to Africa discussing economic, social and political problems facing the world today.

Mr Rafiq Hayat, Amir UK, gave the Closing Remarks and delivered a message from His Holiness, Hazrat Khalifatul Masih V. Before delivering his speech he acknowledged the great work done by President Tommy Kallon and his team in organising the Symposium. Hayat Sahib noted that it is only faith that can bring about peace because the fundamental principles of faith are based on morality, justice and fair play. This will only be possible when faith leaders come together and bring harmony to this world as exemplified through the work done by His Holiness, Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad.

Amir Sahib then read a message from His Holiness addressed to all the attendees of the Symposium as

reproduced on pages 22-23.

Amir Sahib concluded by calling on Africa and her leaders to take heed to Huzur's important advice and thereafter called on the gathering to join him in Silent Prayers. Following the official closing remarks of the Symposium, dinner was served to all attendees.

Overall the PAAMA UK Africa Peace Symposium was a watershed event in the history of PAAMA in various respects. The highly distinguished list of dignitaries and guests in attendance was an indication of the appeal the event had, not only to the members of PAAMA but to the rest of the British society across the board. With a recorded attendance of over 700, this was arguably one of the most successful events ever organised by PAAMA UK and the various post-event feedback received from attendees testified to that. The event was not only well attended but covered a theme which generated so much interest among not only attendees and the various speakers but also media outlets and the whole event was live-streamed by MTA International.

‘Gathering of Africa’s Best’ Awards

PAAMA RECOGNITION AT GAB AWARDS

With the blessed approval of Hazrat Ameerul Mumineen^(aba), on Sunday 3rd December 2017 a PAAMA UK delegation consisting of President Tommy Kallon Sahib, Vice President Shafiq Kusi Sahib, External Affairs Secretary Ibrahim Asante Sahib, Head of Lajna, Faosat Sanni Sahiba and Lajna External Affairs Secretary, Naeema Ahmad Sahiba attended the Gathering of Africa’s Best (GAB) Awards hosted by the Trumpet Media Group.

Ahead of the Awards ceremony, PAAMA UK President Tommy Kallon had been shortlisted as a Finalist for a GAB Award in the Faith category and by the grace of Allah, was a winner on the night being presented an Award of Excellence recognising his *“outstanding contribution to the promotion of the positive image of Africa and Africans around the world through Faith.”*

In his acceptance speech, Tommy Kallon told the distinguished audience that services to Africa and Africans were in fact enshrined in the Mission Statement of PAAMA and that the Khalifa of the Ahmadiyya Muslim Community had so repeatedly urged the members of the Community to discharge the rights due to our Creator and to His creatures that we could not but respond to the call of duty. The event was chaired by President PAAMA UK, Tommy Kallon, and started with Tilawat by Ismail Secundar Sahib and translation by Ousman Maty Sahib. Imam Hafiz Essan Secundar Sahib then gave a brief welcome address and the purpose of the event.

Tommy Kallon Sahib presented 'An Introduction to PAAMA' giving an overview of its history, aims,

objectives and mission statement along with its organisational structure and how it is run in the UK.

Following on from this, elections were held for the office of President PAAMA Belgium.

Upon his return to the UK, Tommy Kallon Sahib submitted a summary of the election results to Hazrat Khalifatul Masih V^(aba) who most graciously appointed Respected Mohammed Elghrazaoui Sahib as the first President of PAAMA Belgium.



PAAMA Funded Mosque in Africa

With blessed approval of Hazrat Khalifatul Masih^(aba), PAAMA launched an appeal to raise funds to build a mosque in Africa. It was the directive of Huzur Aqdas the PAAMA mosque should be built in Burkina Faso.

By the grace of Allah, the members of PAAMA from the UK and beyond responded magnanimously and against an initial target of £5000-10000, we had promises amounting to over £30,000.

Alhamdulillah, the PAAMA mosque in Burkina Faso was completed and named Masjid Nasir by Hazrat Khalifatul Masih^(aba). We proclaim the glory of Allah, celebrate His praise and affirm His Unity for this inestimable favour conferred upon PAAMA.

The mosque is prominently located on the main highway to the Ivory Coast in Banfora City, the fifth largest city in Burkina Faso; a location which attracts many visitors which in turn further promotes the

name and image of the Jama'at in the region.

With a capacity of 250 people, the mosque has one large 45-foot tall minaret, four small minarets and a dome. The flooring is tiled and is complete with electric fans on the ceiling, audio-video facilities and separate area for ablution. The total cost of construction is £15,250.

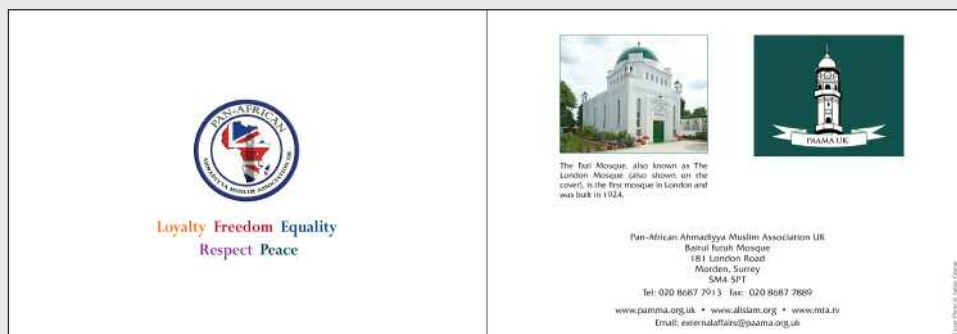

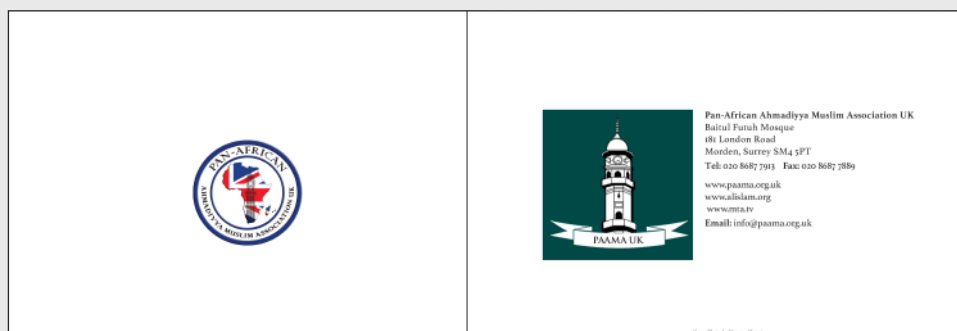
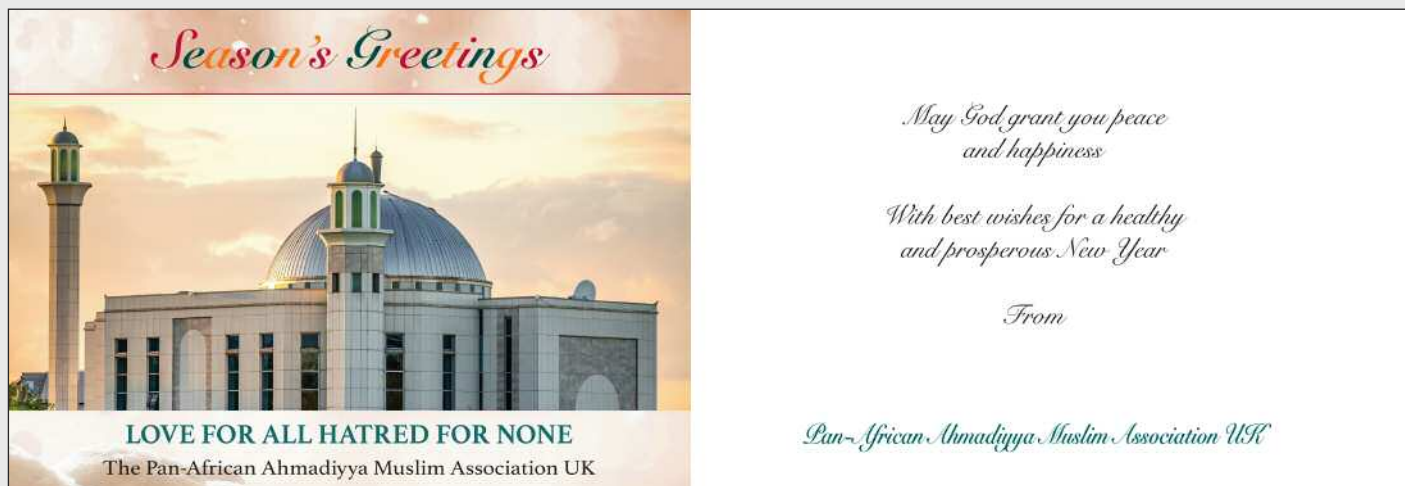

WOMEN are created equal to MEN

*Extract from the Address by Hazrat
Khalifatul Masih V at the Concluding
Session of the National Ijtema of Lajna
Imaillah UK 2017*

“As a result of understanding Islam’s true teachings, the members of the Jama’at, with the Grace of Allah, appreciate the very high status of women according to Islam, and it is a status that most non-Ahmadi Muslims, and the wider non-Muslim population, are not aware of and do not comprehend. Today, your Ijtema, which is purely for Ahmadi women and girls, is concluding and during the event, many activities and events have taken place in order to increase the religious knowledge, morality and spirituality of the participants. Furthermore, from an administrative perspective, this Ijtema has been organised and run by women from start to end, and they will have made a programme that is attuned to the needs and preferences of our ladies and girls. Hence, this Ijtema is a collective and practical demonstration of the great status bestowed upon women by Islam.

One allegation often levelled against our religion is that it discriminates against women or considers them to be less than men. However, this is in complete contrast to Islam’s true teachings. In chapter 4, verse 2 of the Holy Qur’an, the creation of the human race is mentioned and it states that Allah

created humankind from a ‘single soul’. Immediately after this, the Holy Qur’an states *Khalaqa minha zawjaha*, which means ‘created therefrom its mate’. In the Bible, where the creation of man and woman is discussed, the concept of a ‘mate’ is also mentioned, however it goes on to say that a woman was created from the rib of Adam^(as). This is contrary to the teachings of the Holy Qur’an, which clarifies that women were not created out of the body of a man or from his rib. Rather, the Holy Qur’an testifies to the fact that men and women were created from a single soul and are of the same kind and species. Thus, where the Holy Qur’an says ‘created therefrom its mate’ it signifies that Allah Ta’alah has made men and women in the same way and it cannot be said that one is dominant over the other.

Furthermore, when Allah the Almighty has said *Khalaqa minha zawjaha* that He has created woman in the same way that he created man, it becomes clear that Allah has made the hearts and minds of women in the same way that He has created the hearts and minds of men. There is no mention of a woman being created from a man’s rib, rather similarities and likeness are mentioned. Despite this, throughout history, there have been occasions where men have sought to prevent women from fulfilling their potential and responsibilities, whilst at other times, women have sought to stop men from fulfilling their duties and responsibilities. Whether due to a superiority complex or an inferiority complex, at times, men have considered themselves to be intrinsically different to women or women have considered themselves inherently different to men. However, the Holy Qur’an has categorically refuted this concept by saying that men and women are of the same kind. It has clarified that men and women have the same feelings and emotions, similarly as each man will be accountable before Allah for his deeds, so will each woman also be held accountable for her acts before God.”



SECULAR MATTERS

The Moon – The Earth's Companion

The Earth and Moon have been close companions for about 4.5 billion years. Although the Moon is much smaller than the Earth, it influences our planet in many ways and has fascinated humans for thousands of years.

Orbit and Phases of the Moon

The Moon takes 27.3 days to orbit the Earth but, by Allah's supreme design, it also exactly 27.3 days to spin once on its axis. As a result, it keeps the same side facing the Earth – the “near side”.

For centuries, people have been fascinated by the way the Moon goes through a cycle of “phases” that

repeats itself every 29.5 days. These phases occur because we see different amounts of the Moon's sunlit side as the Moon orbits Earth.

Lunar Tides

Tides are created by the Moon's gravity pulling on the Earth's water. At any one time, there is a place on Earth that is nearest to the Moon and one that is furthest away. Here the seas “bulge” out, creating high tides. The bulges move around the Earth as it rotates.

Low tides occur twice a day when a place is at right angles to the Moon's gravity pull. High tides also happen twice a day when a place is aligned with the Moon.

ECLIPSES

Eclipses are among the most spectacular astronomical events that can be witnessed. They occur when the Earth, Moon and Sun all line up so that the Earth casts a shadow over the Moon or the Moon casts a shadow on Earth. The Sun or Moon appear to go dark to the people standing inside these shadows.

In 2017 there were two solar eclipses and two lunar eclipses that were visible partially or in full from different parts of the world on the following dates:

- Penumbral Lunar Eclipse – 11th February 2017
- Annular Solar Eclipse – 26th February 2017
- Partial Lunar Eclipse – 7th August 2017
- Total Solar Eclipse – 21st August 2017

LUNAR ECLIPSES

A lunar eclipse occurs when the Earth comes between the Sun and the Moon. This happens two or three times a year when the Moon passes through the Earth's enormous shadow. Surprisingly the Moon does not become completely black. Some Sunlight is refracted by the Earth's atmosphere and makes the Moon turn orange-red, like a red Sunset.

As per the diagram below, the Earth's shadow can be divided into two distinctive parts: the umbra and penumbra. Within the umbra, there is no direct solar

radiation. However, as a result of the Sun's large angular size, solar illumination is only partially blocked in the outer portion of the Earth's shadow, which is known as the penumbra.

A penumbral lunar eclipse occurs when the moon passes through the Earth's penumbra. The penumbra causes a subtle darkening of the moon's surface. A special type of penumbral eclipse is a total penumbral eclipse, during which the Moon lies exclusively within the Earth's penumbra.

A partial lunar eclipse occurs when only a portion of the moon enters the umbra. When the moon travels completely into the Earth's umbra, one observes a total lunar eclipse.

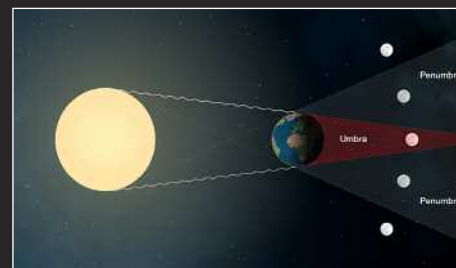

SOLAR ECLIPSES

The Moon passes between the Sun and the Earth every month at “new Moon” but because its orbit is slightly tilted it usually does not pass directly in front of the Sun. Occasionally, however, it does move



directly in front of the Sun and causes a solar eclipse. Although the Sun is 400 times larger than the Moon, by Allah's grand design, it is also 400 times further away. As a result, when viewed from Earth the Moon's disc fits exactly over the Sun's disc during a total eclipse.

A total solar eclipse occurs when the Moon com-

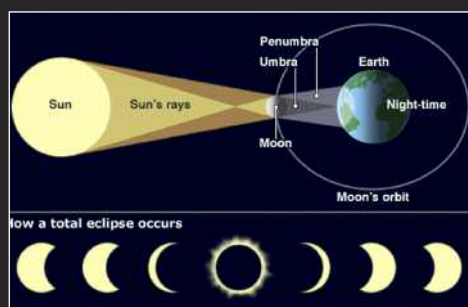

pletely blocks the light from the Sun. All that can be seen is the corona (the Sun's atmosphere) as a shimmering halo of light around it. A total solar eclipse can be seen only from the centre of the Moon's shadow – the umbra. The umbra sweeps

across Earth during an eclipse, tracing a path of thousands of miles long but no more than 60 miles wide. Outside the umbra – the penumbra – the Moon casts a partial solar eclipse.

An annular solar eclipse occurs when the Sun and Moon are exactly in line with the Earth, but the apparent size of the Moon is smaller than that of the

Sun. Hence the Sun appears as a very bright ring, or annulus, surrounding the dark disk of the Moon.
